Background

The United States and Kenya have maintained a dynamic and evolving partnership spanning six decades since the establishment of diplomatic relations in 1964. This relationship has weathered global changes, regional challenges, and transformative developments in both nations, emerging as a cornerstone of stability and cooperation in East Africa and beyond.

From Kenya's early years of independence through to the present day, the U.S.-Kenya partnership has encompassed multiple dimensions of engagement including trade and investment, security cooperation, educational exchanges, technological advancement, and cultural diplomacy. The relationship has evolved from traditional development assistance to a more sophisticated strategic partnership addressing contemporary global challenges such as digital transformation, security threats, and economic empowerment.

Over the past year, the University of Nairobi's Africa Centre for the Study of the United States of America (ACSUS) has conducted an extensive panel discussions examining six thematic areas of this partnership:

- 1. **Trade and Investment Partnership** Exploring the Strategic Trade and Investment Partnership (STIP) and bilateral economic opportunities
- 2. **Partnership in AI and Digital Transformation** Examining collaboration in technology, digital infrastructure, and innovation
- 3. **Creative Economy Partnership** Highlighting collaborations in film, music, fashion, arts, and digital content creation
- 4. **Diaspora Relations** Showcasing the role of the Kenyan diaspora in strengthening bilateral ties
- 5. **Education and Cultural Exchange** Celebrating academic partnerships and people-to-people connections
- 6. **Security Cooperation** Assessing joint efforts in regional stability and counterterrorism

This conference serves as the culminating event of this examination, bringing together the insights, recommendations, and future pathways identified through each thematic seminar. The timing is particularly significant as both nations navigate an increasingly complex global landscape while seeking to deepen their strategic partnership for the next 60 years.









Conference Objectives

- 1. **Synthesize and Present** the key findings, insights, and recommendations from the six-part ACSUS seminar series on U.S.-Kenya relations
- 2. **Facilitate Strategic Dialogue** between senior government officials, diplomats, academics, business leaders, and civil society representatives from both countries
- 3. **Identify Future Opportunities** for enhanced cooperation and partnership in emerging areas of mutual interest
- 4. **Strengthen Networks** and foster new collaborations between American and Kenyan stakeholders across all sectors

Expected Outcomes

- **Immediate Outcomes:** Enhanced understanding among participants of the partnership's evolution, achievements, and challenges
- **Immediate Outcomes**: Strengthened networks and new collaboration opportunities between American and Kenyan stakeholders
- **Medium-term Outcomes:** Publication of a comprehensive conference report synthesizing all seminar series findings and conference discussions

The Africa Center for the Study of the U.S. (ACSUS) was established by the Department of Diplomacy and International Studies (DDIS) at the University of Nairobi on November 11, 2022, with a mission to foster intellectual and cultural exchanges that deepen understanding of U.S.-Africa relations. ACSUS is committed to amplifying African-generated knowledge, empowering scholars, researchers, and students to critically engage with U.S. society, history, and policies.
